About 100 guests teamed up at the 10pin Bowling Lounge for the "Rockin' to the '70s Bowling Tournament" benefiting Canavan Research Illinois. Bowlers wolfed down pizza, while others knocked back martinis and rocked to retro music videos playing overhead. "We became fundraisers out of necessity," said Randell, whose 91/2year-old son Max is challenging expectations for children with Canavan. "The family planned a charity after the doctors said there was no hope." There are challenges in raising Max, said Randell, but "We are changing the face of this disease," her mother added. especially when Max smiles.
